ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING HELPS OUR YOUTH

Pentecost is the day we collect the One Great Hour of Sharing offering.

This special offering is aimed at at-risk children and youth. Forty percent of our giving stays in Chippewa Falls to develop and support programs for young people here.

Twenty-five percent supports Young Adult Volunteers, which provides opportunities to young adults to serve communities around the world.

Twenty-five percent goes to Ministries with Youth to help guide our young people by uniting them in Christ and lifting them up as leaders and messengers of God's word.

The remaining 10% supports vital ministries helping to improve education and provide safe havens for at-risk children.

TINY HOUSE PROJECT GAINS MOMENTUM

The tiny house project of the Mission Coalition is moving right along. So far there are three houses finished and occupied at Trinity United Methodist Church and two more at Landmark Church, according to Mike Cahoon, who spoke at a recent meeting of the group.

Four more houses are being built. Bloomburg High School students and Curt Rahland are in the final stages of building and their houses will probably be ready this month.

Houses at Chippewa High and CVTC are just starting. When completed, these houses will go to the Valley Bible Church and Zion Methodist.

Even though we don't have the space to have our own tiny house, we are busy gathering furnishings for the houses at other churches. Much has already been given, but the coalition still needs a small crock pot, frying pans, a 2-4 cup coffee pot, a mirror (9"X12"), microwave safe dishes, twin or double bed size mattress pads, a can opener, salt and pepper shakers, Corelle dishes and silverware.

PRESBYTERY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The Presbytery of Northern Waters held its Spring Stated Meeting at United Presbyterian Church, Rice Lake, WI on Thursday, May 4, 2017. There were about 60 people in attendance for our meeting on a beautiful Spring day.

Vice Moderator, Rich Blood, conducted a brief orientation for first-time commissioners. We hope to continue this former tradition so that new commissioners have a better chance to understand what goes on at a Presbytery Meeting.

The featured speaker was Diana Barber, retired Associate Synod Executive for Leadership Development. Diana had a PowerPoint presentation on stewardship which included small group discussion and reporting back to the whole assembly. Finance & Budget Chair, Bill Gravelle, and Treasurer, Jay Wilkinson, distributed March 2017 financial summaries showing a surplus in the first quarter of about \$21,000. The total year has a budgeted deficit of \$15,017. They also distributed a summary of the report from the Presbytery's auditors for their review of the 2016 financial records. The Presbytery received reports from various committees including the Overtures & Bylaws Committee, Committee on Ministry and the Committee on Preparation for Ministry. CPM reported on a retreat for four candidates in early March. Training for those wishing to become a Commissioned Ruling Elder continues.

The Presbytery approved all of the Amendments to the Book of Order that were sent to the presbyteries by the 222nd General Assembly (2016). We have received word from the Office of the General Assembly that each of the Amendments has received positive voting by a sufficient number of presbyteries to approve them. They will be included in a new Book of Order that will be available late summer or early fall. If you would like a copy of those

Amendments before the new Book of Order is available, please contact Jay or the Presbytery office.

The Presbytery also approved an addition to the Manual of Operations with guidance for the congregations in establishing parental leave policies for their staff.

The Program Strategy Committee had a presentation from participants in the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance trip to Louisiana in February. All of the participants were energized by their trip and looking forward to possible future trips. Unfortunately, we will likely have future disasters that will make such a trip needed.

Stated Clerk, Brad Carloss, also presented a video from one of the churches he visited during the trip that he and wife, Sheryl, took to Portugal in February and March. Brad would like to encourage a one-on-one relationship between our congregations and congregations in Portugal. Please contact Brad for more information (brad.carloss@gmail.com).

Karen Schuder reported on a grant from the Self Development of People Committee to assist with an anti-racism program. Grants from SDOP are made from part of the One Great Hour of Sharing offering.

We took a great joy in celebrating the ministry of the Reverend Joel Huenemann, United Presbyterian Church, Superior who is retiring at the end of June.

The Presbytery of Northern Waters is also studying what we need and want to be as a Presbytery and what staffing needs in the future will be and how best to be able to afford that staff. Your input to the Transitional Presbytery Administrator, Jay Wilkinson, or to any member of the Presbytery Council is appreciated.

Future meetings will include a visit from the Stated Clerk of the General Assembly, the Reverend Dr. J. Herbert Nelson, II at the October meeting.
